SIDEWALK TALK

As part of the sidewalk project funded by a Community Development Block Grant taking place on Serena Dr. and N 52nd St., the walking path in Serena Park has been paved. This improvement will make enjoyment of the park possible for individuals with mobility challenges, parents with strollers and small children riding bicycles.

ADOPT-A-TREE

The next Adopt-a-Tree planting, managed by the City's Community Development Dept., is scheduled for Saturday, Sept. 7. Temple Terrace residents can apply for inclusion in the program by Aug. 23. Those selected will consult with the City Arborist to choose the most appropriate variety of tree for their yard – live oak, magnolia, bald cypress, sycamore, elm or loquat. The 15-gallon containerized trees then are delivered and planted. AUDIT COMMITTEE LOOKING FOR QUALIFIED APPLICANT

The City currently is seeking qualified applicants for appointment to the Audit Committee. The Temple Terrace Audit Committee was created in 2010 in accordance with Florida State Statute 218.391. The Committee is comprised of a City Council Member, a Certified Public Accountant (CPA) and the Finance Director, who provides staff support. According to policy, the appointee is selected by the City Manager for a term that coincides with the expiration of the approved audit contract. Meetings will be quarterly or on an as needed basis and will be held at City Hall.

Applicants MUST be Certified Public Accountants but are not required to be residents of the City. The closing date for receiving applications is 5pm on Wednesday, September 18.
