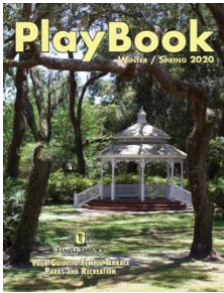
## RELAY FOR LIFE
