THIS JUST IN...

Beginning this Wednesday at 5pm, all Hillsborough County indoor business operators will be required to enforce a mandatory mask order per the County's Emergency Policy Group of which Temple Terrace is a member. There are exemptions for toddlers two and younger and people with medical conditions. This comes on the heels of a State Health Dept. advisory issued over the weekend for all Florida residents to wear masks in public as COVID-19 cases continue to rise.

RECYCLING RETURNS

Following a suspension of collection due to cautions surrounding COVID-19, the City will resume its complimentary recycling program for residents in the following manner:



PAPER AND CARDBOARD

Collection of recyclable paper products will begin the week of June 29. Residents should put paper products **ONLY** in their green bins and place curbside on their regular recycling pick-up day. Bins containing materials other than paper products will not be serviced.



METALS AND PLASTICS

Beginning on July 6, the City will provide strategically placed receptacles around the City in which residents may deposit metals and plastic goods to be collected for recycling.

GLASS

GRANTS AVAILABLE FOR SMALL BUSINESSES

Hillsborough County, Florida Government has more than \$100 million in grants to assist reopened local small businesses economically damaged by the COVID-19 coronavirus pandemic. Business owners will be able to apply for one of three grants:

- Kickstart Small Business Grant - up to \$10,000 in working capital
- Back to Work Grant - up to \$2,000 per employee in payroll incentives to hire or rehire workers
- Safe at Work Matching Grant - up to \$10,000 matching reimbursement for qualifying workplace improvements related to mitigating the spread of COVID-19

PAPER QUILT COMMUNITY PROJECT

The City and the Temple Terrace Arts Council is teaming up to highlight what we love about our City. Think about your favorite things – the big, beautiful trees, the Mid-Century homes, historic Woodmont Park. Maybe it's kayaking on the Hillsborough River, the great sense of community or the intriguing history. Or something completely different...

Then pick up paper squares at one of the blue displays at the Family Recreation Complex or the Temple Terrace Public Library and be creative! You can draw or paint or color on your squares. You can paste paper or buttons or stickers or ribbons or fabric or feathers on them. You can write words, you can use photographs, but stay within the boundary of the square and make it no more than 1/4" thick. (Do not trim your artwork, the Arts Council will do that.) Limit 5 per person, please.

Put your finished squares in the envelope provided and drop them off at one of the displays listed above. Squares will be assembled on large boards in a creative design that mimics a quilt. The final product will be on display at times/places to be announced. Last day to submit or have squares picked up is July 6.
