TTPD JOINS ABLE PROJECT

The Temple Terrace Police Department has been accepted into the Active Bystandership for Law Enforcement (ABLE) Project, Georgetown University Law Center's national training and support initiative for U.S. law enforcement agencies committed to building a culture of peer intervention that prevents harm.

The ABLE Project Train-the-Trainer event begins later this month. In the coming weeks, Temple Terrace Police instructors will be certified as ABLE trainers, and, over the next few months, all officers will receive eight hours of evidence-based active bystandership training designed not only to prevent harm, but to change the culture of policing. The public is invited to follow the progress in this critical area on the City's website and social media and to receive updates at future meetings of City Council.

By demonstrating agency commitment to transformational reform with support from local community groups and elected leaders, Temple Terrace joins a select group of 30 other law enforcement agencies and statewide and regional training academies chosen to participate in the ABLE Project's national rollout. To date, hundreds of agencies across the country have expressed interest in participating.

Backed by prominent civil rights and law enforcement leaders, the evidence-based, field-tested ABLE Project was developed by Georgetown Law's Innovative Policing Program in collaboration with global law firm Sheppard Mullin LLP to provide practical active bystandership strategies and tactics to law enforcement officers to prevent misconduct, reduce officer mistakes and promote health and wellness.



AQUATICS PROGRAM BOASTS “ALL AMERICAN” SWIMMER

One of Team Velocity's swimmers, Bella Answeeney, was named one of the USA Swimming's "All American Athlete" for 2020. Bella is a Sophomore at George Steinbrenner High School. MAKING PROGRESS

Construction fencing is going up around the old Burger King at 56th Street and Bullard Parkway. This property is owned by the Paragon Property Group and is slated to become the "Fountain Shoppes of Temple Terrace." The project will include more than 21,000 square feet of restaurant, retail, banking and class A office space. Paragon C.E.O. Jared Moon is currently finalizing permitting details required for demolition of the old building to make way for a new tower fountain feature on the corner and five free-standing commercial buildings on the site.

DONOHUE APPOINTED TO FLC COMMITTEE

The Florida League of Cities recently announced that City Council member Cheri Donohue has been appointed to serve on the Florida League of Cities 2020-2021 Municipal Administration legislative policy committee.

Legislative policy committee chairs, vice-chairs and members are appointed annually by the League's president. Florida League of Cities President Tony Ortiz, commissioner for the City of Orlando, made the appointments for this term.

As a legislative policy committee member, Donohue will help develop the League's Legislative Action Agenda, which details priority issues that are most likely to affect daily municipal governance and local decision-making during the upcoming legislative session, as well as help League staff understand the real-world implications of proposed legislation and are asked to serve as advocates throughout the legislative process.
