CANDIDATE FORUM SCHEDULED

Three individuals have qualified to run for Temple Terrace City Council in the upcoming General Election. They are Meredith Abel, Raed Khawaja and David Pogorilich. There is one open seat on the Council to be filled in the November 3 election.

The City will host a Candidate Forum on Tuesday, October 13 from 6 to 8pm. The three candidates will answer questions posed by residents regarding their views about the various aspects of the job of a City Council member as defined by the City Charter. Individuals who reside in the City of Temple Terrace can submit questions on an online form on the City's website, via email to public.comment@templeterrace.com or by filling out a comment card at the Family Recreation Complex, 6610 Whiteway Dr., or the Temple Terrace Public Library, 202 Bullard Parkway.

Questions will be accepted until 4pm on Friday, October 9. Submissions will be chosen at random by the moderator during the Forum and there is no guarantee that every question will be asked.

Due to precautions surrounding COVID-19, the Candidate Forum will not be open to the public, but will be broadcast live on the City's cable channels - Frontier Channel 39 and Spectrum Channel 641 - as well shown live and archived on YouTube.

Temple Terrace City Council members serve a four-year term. Council members serve no more than two consecutive terms and may not hold Council office again for a period of two years.

Early voting runs from October 19 to November 1 at the Temple Terrace Public Library, with Election Day on November 3.
