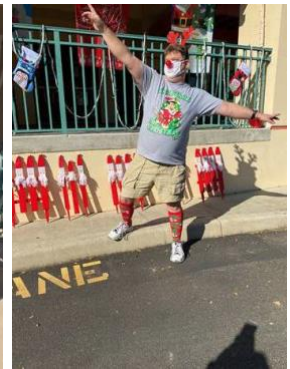

TTFD ANSWERING BURNING QUESTIONS...

Because of the efforts of Chief Kemp, Fire Administration, Captain Cable, Captain Blethen, Engineer McLafferty and Firefighter Alec Hassey (C-Shift, Station 1), our TTFD crews were able to watch a simulation of fire behavior on a small, doll house-sized scale. This simulator allowed crews to identify fire behavior, fire growth, smoke reading (volume, velocity, color, density), ventilation effects, and search and rescue tactics. Thank you to Martin Class with Bradley Construction Co., Inc. for supplying the materials for each simulator. During this burn, TTFD followed all local and state guidelines in regards to COVID-19 precautions. Post-Fire Decon also was performed.
