LIBRARY NEWS

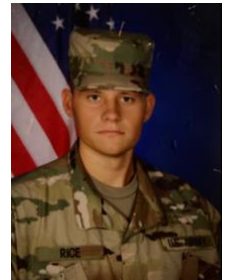

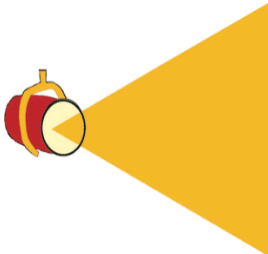
COFFEE WITH A COP IS BACK!
