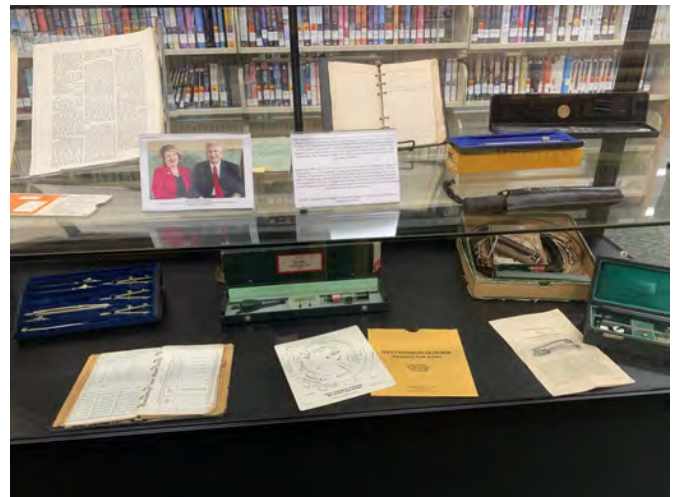


## History Comes to the Library

Paul Tomasino graduated from the University of Florida in 1960 with a bachelor's degree in civil engineering. From 1965 through 1970, he served as the Temple Terrace City Engineer and Director of Public Works. In 1970, Tomasino became Vice President and secretary of the American Engineering, Co. The following summer, he founded and ran his own firm, Tomasino & Associates, until 2006, when the company merged with IBI Group and Tomasino served as the firm's senior advisor.

In the mid-1980s, the City of Temple Terrace experienced a resurgence, thanks in large part to the City Building, Zoning, and Community Development Director, Thomas C. Mortenson, City Attorney Ted Taub, and Paul Tomasino. They were able to triple the tax base and double the city size by annexing Telecom Park and areas adjacent to the city. This allowed Temple Terrace to attract new businesses, create shopping centers, redevelop existing businesses, and greatly expand housing and subdivisions in the community.

In 2007, Tomasino was named Tampa Bay Engineer of the Year by the Florida Engineering Society.
