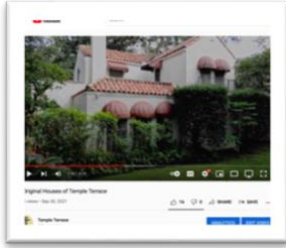
SPRINT (OR STROLL) FOR SAFETY

The City of Temple Terrace once again is teaming up with Bike Walk Tampa Bay to get residents out and active in October with a "Sprint for Safety" Virtual 5K.

Those who choose not to sprint can stroll as part of the initiative. And there's no need to walk alone. Bike Walk Tampa Bay and the City will host a one-mile walk through the Terrace with Mayor Andy Ross on Saturday, Oct. 16. Meet up at 9am at Billy Graham Preservation Park, 913 N. Riverhills Drive, and join Mayor Ross on a route that passes by five of the city's most historic homes. Bike Walk Tampa Bay will have on-site giveaways for all walkers, who can sign up at the link below to receive a completion certificate.
