FALLEN OFFICERS HONORED



The Florida Police Chiefs Association (FPCA) and the Florida Sheriffs Association (FSA) have again designated the month of September as Law Enforcement Service and Sacrifice Month to honor those Florida law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty in 2021. Sadly, this includes a growing number who have succumbed to COVID-19 while protecting our communities.

So far this year, 21 officers have died, including 14 from COVID-19. To honor and remember their fallen colleagues, the Florida Police Chiefs Association calls on all law enforcement to wear mourning bands the entire month of September and publicly salute the service of all fallen law enforcement officers in the state of Florida.
